


READING II EPH 1:3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory.

GOSPEL MK 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

FR. JOHN'S DIGITAL QUILL FOR SPIRITUAL MUSINGS AND PARISH NEWS

Parish School of Religion (PSR)

We are so grateful to so many families who trust St. Raphael the Archangel School for the education of their children. I am also aware that some families have chosen to send their child to a public or charter school that may not necessarily have a faith background. In these cases, families often send their students to a Parish School of Religion Program (PSR).

St. Raphael the Archangel is a partnering parish in the South City Deanery PSR Program at St. John the Baptist. I also respect those families that have chosen to be part of the PSR Program at Epiphany Parish.

If you are a parishioner of St. Raphael the Archangel and plan on sending your child(ren) to a PSR program for the 2021-22 school year, I ask that you meet with me by October 15 of this year. This meeting is so we can touch base on where your child is in faith formation and how the parish can serve your family. I believe this meeting is so essential that any parish portion of program fees for your chosen PSR Program will be withheld until this meeting takes place.

Parents are the first educators of their children, and I in no way want to infringe on this parental obligation. I simply want to be sure that all of our young people are learning the faith and all of our families feel welcomed and involved in the life of the parish.

Becoming a Godparent or Confirmation Sponsor?

Another sign of life beginning to return to normal is that many more people are wanting to have their children baptized or to be a Confirmation sponsor for someone out of town. Many parishes are now asking that candidates for these roles have a form signed by the pastor of their parish to certify that they are suitable candidates for this role, especially by practicing their faith through regular attendance at Sunday Mass.

With the reinstatement of the Sunday Mass obligation, I ask, if you have one of these forms needing my signature, that you see me after a Saturday evening or Sunday Mass to have the form signed. This is so that I can get to know you better and to verify that you do meet the qualifications to serve as a Godparent or a Confirmation Sponsor.

Thank you for your help in this matter and for serving as a great mentor to our young people!

BEFORE YOU COME TO MASS

- Thoroughly wash your hands.
- If you are fully vaccinated, you do not need to wear a mask in church if you choose not to.
- If you are not fully vaccinated, or feel more comfortable wearing a mask, please bring a mask to wear during Mass.
- If you are sick or are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, please stay home and participate in Mass virtually.

DURING MASS

- Use the provided hand sanitizer as you enter and leave the church.
- Drop off your offertory gift in the basket located at the Highfield and Jamieson entrances.
- Please practice social distancing as you choose where to sit, as you process to receive Holy Communion, and as you enter and leave the church.
- Thank God for the gift of being able to attend Mass.
- Grab a bulletin as you enter or leave the church.

REMINDERS

- The pews will remain closed off to encourage social distancing. As needed, sections of pews will be opened to accommodate additional congregants.
- Clergy will continue to wear masks during the Liturgy of the Eucharist, including when distributing Holy Communion.
- The pews are sprayed with disinfectant daily and the entire church is mopped as well.
- Twice per week, our cleaning company sprays the church with Virex, a chemical that is certified safe for hospitals and nurseries, but kills all viruses, including COVID-19.

South City Deanery PSR Registration

South City Deanery PSR provides formal Catholic religious education (Grade 1 to Confirmation prep) for the children in parishes of the South City Deanery. Sessions are on Monday evenings, September through May from 6:20-7:40pm.

Our program continues and supplements the religious formation from parents, who are the first teachers of their children in the ways of the faith. We assist families in the areas of knowledge of the faith, beliefs and Christian life skills and religious practices, and strengthening the growing relationship with Jesus and his Church.

Registration for 2021-2022 South City Deanery PSR year will be held on:

August 15 (Sunday) from 11:00am to 1:00 pm in the Cafeteria at St. John the Baptist Parish August 23 (Monday) from 6:00-8:00pm in the St. John the Baptist Parish Center

<u>First Reconciliation and First Communion</u> are usually done as part of the 2nd grade curriculum. We also have preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion for students grades 3-8 <u>Students must be in the PSR</u> program for two years in order to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion.

<u>Confirmation</u> is usually done in the 8th grade and above. <u>Students must be in the PSR program for two years (Pre-Confirmation and Confirmation classes) before being confirmed.</u>
