Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." DMI Results: Core Catholic Teaching on the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

The image above is Raphael's painting entitled "Disputation on the Sacrament." In it, we see many popes, bishops, other clerics, as well as lay people, discussing the Blessed Sacrament, which is exposed on the altar. Above the Blessed Sacrament is the Holy Trinity, along with Mary, St. John the Baptist, angels, and apostles.

There is a deep meaning to this painting. We know from the Book of Revelation that at the center of Heaven is Jesus, the Lamb of God. (cf. Rev. 5) On Earth, the center of our worship is the Eucharist, here pictured exposed in the monstrance on the altar. But there is a contrast in the scene. In Heaven, there is relative peace with Jesus reigning in the center. On Earth, we see some people in quiet prayer, but many more discussing, thinking, and even turning away from the Eucharist.

The Eucharist, the true presence of Jesus on Earth, is meant to bring peace to us. Yet it remains a source of division, as it did when Jesus first taught about the Real Presence in John 6. In a 2019 Pew Study, 69% of Catholics believed the Eucharist was just a symbol, not Jesus truly present.

Thankfully here at St. Raphael, belief in the Real Presence is strong. Sixty-six percent of people surveyed in the DMI strongly agreed that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist and 16% agreed. Eight percent of those surveyed were indifferent on this teaching and seven percent were unsure.

So why do we believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist?

Catholics are sometime criticized for not taking the Bible literally enough. Yet the Eucharist is a powerful instance when the Church does take Scripture quite literally. When Jesus says, "I am the bread of life," we take Jesus at His word. (Jn 6:35)

It is not only in John 6 that Jesus assures us He is giving us His Body and Blood. At the Last Supper, Jesus says, "This is my Body...This is my Blood." (Mt. 26:26,28) He never says that the bread and wine are symbols or images of Himself, but they are truly Him. This wording supports exactly what St. Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians, written just 15 years after Jesus' death and resurrection. (cf. 1 Cor 11:23-25)

Some say that the Church began to believe in the Real Presence in the Middle Ages with saints such as Thomas Aquinas, who developed the doctrine of Transubstantiation. It is not Thomas who invented this teaching, but instead Thomas is trying to explain the teaching already present in the Church, as both Scripture and history prove.

We believe that everything the Catholic Church teaches is true. While the truth is compelling, the power of the Church comes from the Eucharist. It is the Eucharist that makes the Church the Church. For further reflection:
