READING I JER 23:1-6

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture, says the LORD. Therefore, thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, against the shepherds who shepherd my people: You have scattered my sheep and driven them away. You have not cared for them, but I will take care to punish your evil deeds. I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow; there they shall increase and multiply. I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble; and none shall be missing, says the LORD.

Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will raise up a righteous shoot to David; as king he shall reign and govern wisely, he shall do what is just and right in the land. In his days Judah shall be saved, Israel shall dwell in security. This is the name they give him: "The LORD our justice."

In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory.

GOSPEL MK 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

School Reopening Update

This week, the Archdiocese of Saint Louis announced a masking policy for schools for the upcoming school year. The policy states that parents will have the option of choosing whether or not their child wears a mask to school.

We are certainly aware of this policy of the Archdiocese. However, we are equally aware of the decision of Saint Louis City Schools to require masks for all students. As of the writing of this article, the St. Louis City Health Department has not issued its guidance of what it will require.

Below is an excerpt of a communication from Mrs. Hayes that outlines our plan for announcing how we will open school in the most normal and safest way possible.

The SRA Administration and Covid-19 Task Team will meet throughout July to review the updated guidelines by both the Archdiocese of St. Louis and the St. Louis Department of Health. The upcoming two weeks will provide the SRA Task Team time to monitor current health concerns and evaluate updated guidelines and policies provided by the health department and the Archdiocese.

Like last year, the SRA Task Team will: continue developing procedures and policies for the 2021-2022 school year. We have the same goal to ensure a healthy and safe learning environment for our students. Look for the Reopening School Covid-19 Plan for the 2021-2022 school year in early August.

Pray, Brothers and Sisters, that My Sacrifice and Yours

One of the priests I am traveling with this week pointed out this phrase as one he uses when speaking about returning to Mass. This line of dialogue is said by the priest after washing his hands. It may not sound as familiar, as this is also the cue for the people to stand up after sitting for the Offertory. But it is a good line to reflect on as a reason why regular attendance at Mass is important.

Certainly, we can see how the Eucharist is a sacrifice by the priest. He stands at the altar offering the prayers of the Mass and following the actions required by the rubrics to offer the sacrifice. But it is not an action done in private by the priest that others come and just watch.

One of the hardest things for priests about the lockdown was not seeing people in the pews. While it was hard to time the dialogue on a livestream when you were celebrating Mass alone or just with another priest, this was not the only reason. Over time, a priest develops a spiritual sense of people praying the Mass with him.

People pray the Mass by offering their joys, hopes, sorrows, fears, and pains along with the priest's own sacrifice. Together, this sacrifice is offered to the Father through Christ and we receive in return the great grace of the Eucharist.

While this same sacrifice is offered with just a priest or with a packed church, people comment to me how much more powerful the Mass is when the church is full. With this phrase, it makes sense. The more people coming together to offer their part of the sacrifice make it more powerful, not just for the priest, but for everyone at that Mass.

Yes, Mass will happen if you are there or not. But when you are not there at Mass, there is truly something missing in our community: your prayerful sacrifice. I ask that you consider this the next time you wonder about coming to Mass.

Church of Saint Raphael the Archangel Guidelines for Attending Mass

BEFORE YOU COME TO MASS

- Thoroughly wash your hands.
- If you are fully vaccinated, you do not need to wear a mask in church if you choose not to.
- If you are not fully vaccinated, or feel more comfortable wearing a mask, please bring a mask to wear during Mass.
- If you are sick or are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, please stay home and participate in Mass virtually.

DURING MASS

- Use the provided hand sanitizer as you enter and leave the church.
- Drop off your offertory gift in the basket located at the Highfield and Jamieson entrances.
- Please practice social distancing as you choose where to sit, as you process to receive Holy Communion, and as you enter and leave the church.
- Thank God for the gift of being able to attend Mass.
- Grab a bulletin as you enter or leave the church.

REMINDERS

- The pews will remain closed off to encourage social distancing. As needed, sections of pews will be opened to accommodate additional congregants.
- Clergy will continue to wear masks during the Liturgy of the Eucharist, including when distributing Holy Communion.
- The pews are sprayed with disinfectant daily and the entire church is mopped as well.
- Twice per week, our cleaning company sprays the church with Virex, a chemical that is certified safe for hospitals and nurseries, but kills all viruses, including COVID-19.

South City Deanery PSR Registration

South City Deanery PSR provides formal Catholic religious education (Grade 1 to Confirmation prep) for the children in parishes of the South City Deanery. Sessions are on Monday evenings, September through May, from 6:20-7:40pm.

Our program continues and supplements the religious formation from parents, who are the first teachers of their children in the ways of the faith. We assist families in the areas of knowledge of the faith, beliefs and Christian life skills and religious practices, and strengthening the growing relationship with Jesus and his Church.

Registration for 2021-2022 South City Deanery PSR year will be held on:

August 15 (Sunday) from 11:00am to 1:00 pm in the Cafeteria at St. John the Baptist Parish

August 23 (Monday) from 6:00 – 8:00pm in the St. John the Baptist Parish Center

First Reconciliation and First Communion are usually done as part of the 2nd grade curriculum. We also have preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion for students grades 3-8

Students must be in the PSR program for two years in order to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion.

<u>Confirmation</u> is usually done in the 8th grade and above. <u>Students must be in the PSR program for two years (Pre-Confirmation and Confirmation classes) before being confirmed.</u>


