

Gospel Lk 12:13-21

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." Then he told them a parable. "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"' But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

From St. Vincent de Paul Society

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who selfishly stored all his grain and goods only to die and be unable enjoy his abundance. What we struggle to learn all our lives is that life does not consist of possessions nor our perceived security, but of being possessed by God. This week, as we give our gifts to the Society, we are realizing that, in giving, we indeed receive.

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." Luke 12:15

The Gospel message is contrary to modern culture that continually tries to convince us that our joy comes from the material things we possess. That the more we acquire, the happier we will be. Jesus shows us that true joy comes from our "invisible" gifts, such as love, mercy, and forgiveness. True joy comes from "emptying" ourselves, giving of ourselves rather than always taking. We are called not to hoard but to share. True joy comes from living a grateful and generous lifestyle, becoming more "God-centered" and less "self-centered."

Guest Column: Compassion vs. Criticism By David Baranowski, Director of Parish Stewardship & Leadership Formation Archdiocese of St. Louis

"Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own eye?" (Matthew 7:3) Many of us are blind to our own sin. Plus, we tend to down grade our own transgressions as compared to others'. Judging or recognizing someone's faults is not a sin in itself. It's when we arrogantly pass judgment on others while forgetting our own more serious faults that judging becomes a problem.

"Stop judging me" is a common phrase heard today, especially when people do not agree on a topic. There are times when someone is actually "judging" someone else and that is wrong. However, there are also many times when someone is just "disagreeing" with someone else and not "judging,", but disagreement is interpreted as judgment. Our culture has become too lax in the way we talk and in the way we listen to each other. There was a time when people sought common ground with each other, rather than immediately becoming mortal enemies over a simple disagreement.

We used to give each other the "benefit of the doubt." We used to be more compassionate and less critical, in the way we talked to each other and in the way we listened to each other. We now reap what we have sown - the lack of trust in God is compounds itself in our lack of trust in each other.

How do we counter this? Archbishop Charles Chaput said, "If we are holy, others will more easily hear their call to holiness." We all know many fallen away Catholics and Christians. The good news is they were all baptized. They all have the indelible mark of God on their souls through Baptism. They are still daughters and sons of God, even if they don't realize it. People crave God, but haven't recognized that only He can fill that longing, that hole in their hearts.

Here is our chance to be examples of holiness to others, to model joyful Catholic lifestyles that attract people. We are in a time in our world, in our country, and in our diocese when we need to demonstrate the Golden Rule – "Do to others whatever you would have them do to you." (Matthew 7:12) It's time for all of us to intentionally share our faith and resources with those that are both physically and spiritually in need. And, we need to do this with more compassion and less criticism. Let's start today to pray for people in our lives that negatively challenge us.
