

### READINGS FOR JUNE 13, 2021

READING I EZ 17:22-24

Thus says the Lord GOD: I, too, will take from the crest of the cedar, from its topmost branches tear off a tender shoot, and plant it on a high and lofty mountain; on the mountain heights of Israel I will plant it. It shall put forth branches and bear fruit, and become a majestic cedar. Birds of every kind shall dwell beneath it, every winged thing in the shade of its boughs. And all the trees of the field shall know that I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom. As I, the LORD, have spoken, so will I do.

**READING II** 2 COR. 5:6-10

Brothers and sisters: We are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

GOSPEL MK 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

#### Parish Consecration to the Sacred Heart

On June 2, 2019, our parish was consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Last year, as we were just getting back to Mass from the COVID lockdowns, we had a more private remembrance of this consecration.

This Sunday, we will renew that consecration publicly after the homily. Please see the last page of the bulletin for the prayer we will pray together as a community.

Why should we renew this consecration? God is never outdone in generosity to us! Our renewal of the consecration states our openness to receive from God even more of the good graces He has prepared for us.

What are these graces He wants to give us? Jesus made 12 promises to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Most poignant this year are these graces that Jesus promised to St. Margaret Mary:

I will establish peace in their homes.

I will comfort them in all their afflictions.

I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.

I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.

I will bless every place in which an image of My Heart is exposed and honored.

We are trying to do something no one has done before: resume normal parish life after 15 months of being shut down. As we have seen from the reopening of the rest of society, it is not as easy as flipping a switch. We need God's help to make this a smooth movement towards reopening.

May we thus embrace this renewal with new vigor and desire for God's blessings and graces.

#### Men's Club Meeting

One good sign of returning to normal is that our Men's Club will resume meeting this Tuesday, June 15,

at 7:00pm in the cafeteria. We will follow the CDC guidelines that vaccinated persons are not required to wear masks but may do so if they choose to. Nonvaccinated persons are asked to wear a mask.

I know that other groups and organizations in our parish will be looking to get back to meeting in the next few months. If your group is interested in resuming meeting, please contact the parish office to ensure that your meeting time and place is reserved.

#### **Mass Mandate Update**

Last Friday, I did send out a Flocknote informing everyone that the mandate to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation will resume on July 1.

With the beginning of the lockdown 15 months ago, the Archbishop took the unprecedented step of suspending the obligation to attend Mass. Top health officials recommended that larger events such as Mass be curtailed as much as possible to slow the spread of COVID. While we had a time where Mass was closed to the public, the public celebration of Mass has resumed.

The resumption of the Mass mandate does mean that to choose not to attend Mass for a grave reason such as being sick, homebound, or in an immunocompromised state does not constitute a mortal sin.

that we perceive as good. No one gets up and knowingly decides to choose something bad. A sin is when we choose a lesser good than the highest good.

For example, in deciding to attend Mass or not, we may choose the good of attending Mass or the good the Church. Please understand that this is the sole inof sleeping in, getting more chores done, or going to sporting activities. These are all good things, but as God calls us to in the Ten Commandments, the highest good is to attend Mass on the Sabbath.

Under sin, there are two categories of sin: mortal and venial. A sin is mortal when:

- The sin is something serious, such as missing Mass
- I know it is wrong
- Even though I know it is wrong, I freely choose to do it anyway.

Any sin that does not meet one of these criteria is a venial (or lesser) sin.

Mortal sin turns us away from God, as we have

freely chosen a lesser good over relationship with Him. Venial sin lessens the relationship with God, but does not totally turn us away from Him.

While venial sins can be forgiven in many ways, such as prayer, attending Mass, or doing good works, mortal sin can only be forgiven through the Sacrament of Confession. Thus, after July 1, if I fail to attend Mass one Sunday without a valid reason, I need to go to confession before receiving Holy Communion. I can and should attend Mass, but I should not present myself for Holy Communion. To receive Holy Communion in the state of mortal sin is to commit the sin of sacrilege (receiving a sacred thing unworthily), which is also a mortal sin.

Now many times today, we can hear people, including clergy, say God will not send someone to Hell for missing Mass. But remember: God does not send anyone to Hell. At death, God reviews our lives with us in the clear light of truth and asks, did we practice love for God and love for others. Our choices throughout our lives determine where we will be eternally.

The Church, while never condemning anyone to Hell, does teach that even one mortal sin that is not repented for, is enough for a soul to be judged to spend eternity in Hell.

Saint Paul in 1 Corinthians 9:16 tells the Corin-Whenever we choose, we choose for something thians that it is imposed upon him to preach the Gospel. Like St. Paul, I have a mandate to faithfully preach the Gospel to you, the people of St. Raphael the Archangel Parish. These are hard things to write and to hear, but they are part of the Gospel as preached by spiration to write this column this Sunday.


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# RENEWAL OF OUR PARISH CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS
