Entrance Antiphon Cf. Ps 27 (26): 7, 9

O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Savior!

Reading 1 Ex 19:2-6a

In those days, the Israelites came to the desert of Sinai and pitched camp. While Israel was encamped here in front of the mountain, Moses went up the mountain to God. Then the LORD called to him and said, "Thus shall you say to the house of Jacob; tell the Israelites: You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself. Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."

Reading 2 Romans 5:6-11

Brothers and sisters: Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Gospel Matthew 9:36—10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Transition Information

This past Monday, Fr. Molini visited St. Raphael as is typical during a pastor transition. I gave him a tour of the entire facility and he was very interested to see the parish and school. Overall, he was impressed by the condition of our facility and the care we have put into it.

We both realize there are many rumors right now. Please be assured that neither he nor I have any specifics about the future. Fr. Molini is very much in the mode of any new pastor: wanting to get to know people and the parish before making definitive future plans.

After our meeting, I am even more convinced of the providence of the Holy Spirit in sending Fr. Molini to our parish. The staff was struck by his good humor, and I was reminded again of his caring, listening heart and willingness to be a good shepherd for the parish through prudent leadership.

I would expect not much will happen in terms of transition next week because I am out of town. We will announce in July an interim Mass schedule that will take effect on August 1, so please keep an eye out for that.

Otherwise, our parish remains in a normal summer mode. I would like to commend our maintenance crew for taking charge in cleaning the school again this summer to get it ready for another year. I know that, when finished, it will be sparkly and ready for the new academic year. With this in mind, I ask that people be aware of signs in the building and not enter marked areas that have wet wax. Mr. Bob and his crew are working expeditiously to get areas reopened, but when people walk through the wet wax, it just doubles the time that area is closed, as the wax has to be reapplied. Please help us by staying out of those areas with warnings of wet wax.

Also, we realize people have many personal summer events for their family and friends. Please help us be good stewards of our parish and school property by reserving rentals with the parish office, the Men's Club, or the Ladies' Club. During the summer months, many items go missing. These need to be replaced and the costs come from either the parish or the organizations' budgets, taking away funds from other needed projects and improvements. Thank you for your assistance be being worthy stewards of these goods.

I will be away from the parish beginning on Sunday after Masses and will return before the 4:30pm Mass on Saturday. During this time away, I will check e-mail and voicemails regularly. Again, I would like to thank the many people who step up while I am gone to make it possible for me to take a little time away from the parish.



What happens to all of that cash?



Dobbs Decision Anniversary




June 24 marks the one-year anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in Dobbs v.
