#### **Decline To Sign!**

Pro-abortion supporters are attempting to put forth a ballot measure that would add an amendment to the Missouri Constitution that would legalize abortion throughout all stages of pregnancy. The ballot measure advocates for a right to dangerous late-term abortions paid for with taxpayer money and without parental consent for minors and without regard for the health of Missouri women. Starting this month through May 5, signature gatherers are in the process of collecting approximately 172,000 valid signatures in six out of eight congressional districts. DECLINE TO SIGN any such petition because no prolife groups in Missouri are collecting signatures to support this effort.




