

READINGS FOR MAY 2, 2021: FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

READING I ACTS 9:26-31

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus.

The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and progressing in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers.

READING II 1 JN 3:18-24

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

GOSPEL JN 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."



Mrs. Liz: Pre-School B

We have been busy in Preschool B! We worked on the letters V and W and recently completed an "All About Me" unit. We talked about the things that make us unique and made an "All About Me" book. Our favorite activity from this unit was making the members of our families out of popsicle sticks and creating houses for them using Play Doh and blocks. This was a great STEM activity and each one was different and full of innovation and creativity!

Second Grade News: Miss Hayley Franks

Second grade has begun our Time unit! We are excited to use this new skill to keep our daily schedule in order. We also finished our Living Organisms unit by creating habitats for our "Desk Pets." Each desk pet has a custom-made habitat to live in while it helps us stay focused throughout the rest of the year.

Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: The fifth graders are studying the Sacraments at the Service of Communion. They are learning about how to listen for their calling and the various types of vocations. During math, the students are learning how to add and subtract mixed numbers and how to multiply fractions. The students read a humorous story about a cowboy that has outrageous skills during literature. They learned about hyperboles and then created their own creative story using hyperboles!

Fourth Grade: The fourth graders have been working on fractions. They learned how to find equivalent fractions, simplify fractions, compare/order, and add/subtract fractions. The students have been working on comparing/contrasting along with sequencing in literature class.

Mrs. Dana Lahm: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8)

4th Grade students are exploring the different types of forces and motion.

5th Grade students are studying our Solar System and the revolution of the planets around the sun. Students are learning about earth's movements of rotation and revolution and how the positions of the moon, earth, and sun cause the phases of the moon, eclipses, and tides.

6th, 7th, & 8th Grade students are learning about the chemical reactions of photosynthesis and cellular respiration, and the processes of mechanical and chemical digestion.

Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8) The 6th-8th graders have been working on writing essays. They have written several first drafts. They are going to choose one to add to, revise, and edit.

The students are also writing poetry. They're experimenting with free-verse poetry, along with imitation poetry and two voices poems. (April is National Poetry Month.)
