Fr. Molini's Notes

Complete Joy

In our Gospel today, our Lord offers the gift of joy: "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." What a gift and what a concept...complete joy! The fundamental truth in this is that joy is rooted in love, the love of God and the love of our neighbor. Not the false image of love so readily proffered by our society that is rooted in self-gratification, self-satisfaction, or the accumulation of "things." The love that leads to joy is not self-focused at all. True love that leads to joy is found in the generous care we have for another. The sacrificial act for another. The personal choice that places the good of another as my motivation in my words, actions, and charity.

While this love is accessible to us all, it is beautifully manifested in married love, the love shared by a couple who seeks the good of another. The Church has consistently held up marriage as a sign of God's love for us all. As God's love is permanent, faithful, sacrificial, and life-giving, so the love of a couple reflects this love, first the couple, and then by extension, the rest of us who witness what this love offers.

So, from one who does not participate directly in the Sacrament of Marriage, thanks to all who witness God's love through their sacramental unions. May your generosity of love toward each other bring joy and remain a testament to God's love that benefits us all.

The "Mary" Month of May

Historically, the month of May has been dedicated to our Blessed Mother as a sign of devotion from her children. If a family prayer time is not a practice yet in your family, perhaps this month would be a good time to initiate such a practice. If a Rosary may be a little much to start with, what about a decade each weekday, inviting the children to lead a "Hail Mary" and pray for special intentions each day. Trite but true: The family that prays together, stays together.

Over the prior 6 months, the Pastoral Council undertook to write down a statement of its purpose in order to help with the recruitment of new members. The process of developing a written statement of purpose (our discussions and reflections) was, for us, a *renewal* of what we are called to do for the parish. Under the direction of Fr. Molini, the Pastoral Council will encourage all parish organizations to create similar statements for themselves and to consider how they assist their members to place Jesus at the center of their lives. A copy of our Statement of Purpose is published in this bulletin. Parish Council has been "re-branded." The new title for our organization, Pastoral Council, reflects that we help lead toward pastoral goals for the parish, to administer and to care for one another, and to lead all to Christ. If you have a matter you want to bring to our attention, we would appreciate hearing from you. Pastoral Council

Purpose

St. Raphael the Archangel's Pastoral Council promotes dialogue among parishioners to assist the Pastor in his leadership role toward fulfilling the mission of Jesus Christ.

Who We Are

Pastoral Council members consist of parishioners committed to prayer, whose lives actively reflect their Catholic Faith, especially by weekly attendance at Saturday evening or Sunday Mass. Members commit to growing to be more like Christ though service to the parish.

Members provide input on topics at Pastoral Council meetings, volunteer at various parish and school functions and are visible and approachable to parishioners to foster greater communication among all aspects of parish life, being respectful of confidentiality.

Service on Council

After a proper period of discernment and prayer, and being led by the Holy Spirit, candidates called to serve from among parishioners by sitting members of Pastoral Council, are presented to the Pastor for appointment to the Council.

Members of Pastoral Council are asked to serve for a three-year term beginning in January. Each year, three new candidates shall be appointed to the Council. Appointments should overlap such that new members are consistently appointed to the seats of members whose terms expire. The Council consists of nine (9) members, and the Pastor, who serves in an ex officio capacity as head of Pastoral Council.

What We Do

Members of the Pastoral Council serve as advisors to the Pastor. Members advice may include areas of pastoral development, financial matters, effectiveness of programs and organizations, contribute to the annual report, and general parish concerns.

Members also serve as a resource to parishioners and parish organizations to bring matters to the Pastoral Council for consideration.

The members of the Pastoral Council may also be asked to help parishioners and parish organizations to deepen their faith and build the community through supporting parish efforts in these areas. (Continued on Page 7.)

Members are asked to share with parishioners the efforts of the Pastoral Council for broader input. Members are also encouraged to speak with parish organizations, serving as a resource for them in fostering greater communication and fostering deeper fulfillment of our mission as a Catholic parish community.

Offices of the Pastoral Council

From time to time, members of the Council shall serve in leadership offices. There shall be an office of president, vice president and secretary. All other members of the Council serve *at-large* to promote dialogue with the entire parish and among parish organizations. The responsibilities of officers of the Council are:

President. The president shall serve at the appointment of the Pastor and shall be responsible for organizing and presiding at Council meetings. The president shall present an agenda each meeting, having consulted the Pastor. Members are urged to offer topics for the agenda.

Vice President. The vice president shall serve at the appointment of the Pastor and shall assist the president with organizing Council meetings, and shall preside at Council meetings where the president is not in attendance.

Secretary. The secretary shall serve at the appointment of Pastor and shall be responsible for recording discussions during Council meetings and to provide minutes of meetings to the members. The secretary shall retain such minutes for the benefit of Council.

At-large members. At-large members shall attend Council meetings, receive minutes of meetings, and provide such input and counsel as necessary to fulfill the purpose of the Council. All members are entitled to place matters on an agenda for meetings, upon consultation with the president and Pastor.

Meetings

Pastoral Council shall meet at such times as may be convenient and necessary to fulfill the purpose of the Council, and at the direction of the Pastor. Under regular circumstances, the Pastoral Council shall meet in person six times annually, at such time and location as shall be directed by the Pastor in consultation with the president. Council may choose to not to meet at given times upon proper notice to, and consultation with, members.

Meeting Time: TBD Meeting location: Fireplace Room, Parish Office Lower Level

Also, given the current configuration of pastoral leadership, a joint meeting with the Pastoral Council of St. Gabriel the Archangel Parish is recommended and encouraged once or twice a year to foster inter-parish cooperation and show a unity among Catholics in the St. Louis Hills area.


