

MAY 8, 2022 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON Cf. Ps 33 (32): 5-6

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

Reading I Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God. On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Good Shepherd Sunday

This Sunday is traditionally known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." On this the Fourth Sunday of Easter, the liturgy always includes part of Jesus' discourse on the Good Shepherd from *John 10*.

This Sunday is important to me, as it is a time to pause and reflect on my own life and vocation. When I entered the seminary (20 years ago in August), I wanted to be a shepherd after Jesus' own Heart. I wanted to celebrate the sacraments, meet with people in spiritual direction and pastoral counseling, and walk with people through the events in parish life and in their own lives as well.

Year by year, I find some successes and quite a number of shortcomings from this ideal. Certainly, in part, I was young and naïve about the world and I know I tend to be harder on myself than I should be. After reflection and discussion with brother priests over the last several years, I realize that the priesthood today is simply not what it is meant to be.

To be a priest today in a parish means spending many hours doing administration. This may be financially related to helping the parish with an area of personal interest such as IT or maintenance items. It may mean drafting e-mails on various topics, fundraising, and/or solving human resource concerns. In short, the time I spend doing what I was ordained for, being a priest, is probably only 10-20% of my week's work.

I feel this imbalance has been especially present since being assigned to St. Raphael. When I arrived, we found ourselves in a tight place financially. After coming together through that situation, we experienced the small flood in the school in September of 2019 that took several months to put right. By late February 2020, we began COVID restrictions. As you all know, COVID has been part of our lives ever since to one degree or another.

My goal in reflecting on this with you is twofold:
First, is this the priesthood we want as a parish
or as an Archdiocese? Do we want to see priests spend
greater time doing things they were not trained to do
nor ordained to carry out? I am not arguing for the
priest to abdicate all leadership in the parish, but I ask
for creative thinking, especially with All Things New un-

derway, about how we as Church envision the role of the priest in the parish today.

Second, the real desire of my heart is to be a priest who does walk more intentionally with the people in his parish. Since arriving here, circumstances have dictated that I be more of an administrator of parish and school policies. This is not how I primarily want to be known. My prayer in the months ahead is that I can be more of a shepherd walking with the people than an administrator. I pray, on this Good Shepherd Sunday, that you will join with me in prayer.
