

# READINGS FOR MAY 9, 2021: SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

READING I ACTS 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being."

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."

While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God.

Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. ### Weekly Devotion for the Year of St. Joseph

The Vatican on May 1 added seven invocations to the Litany of St. Joseph in honor of the Year of St. Joseph.

The Latin and English phrases are: "Custos Redemptoris" (Protector of the Redeemer); "Serve Christi" (Servant of Christ); "Minister salutis" (Minister of salvation); "Fulcimen in difficultatibus" (Support in difficulty); "Patrone exsulum" (Patron of refugees); "Patrone afflictorum" (Patron of the afflicted); and "Patrone pauperum" (Patron of the poor).

### SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES

#### Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8)

Grades 6-8 students have been researching countries for Civitas. Civitas is a model UN program. Each student is a delegate for a country, and as a representative is trying to solve (as part of the simulation) a serious problem the country has.

Some of the problems are human rights issues. Some are environmental - severe pollution or natural disasters - for example.

Our General Assembly is on May 12. On that day, several delegates will present their resolution to the group. The other delegates will make suggestions and ask questions, the resolutions might get modified, and then the group will vote on each resolution--just as the United Nations does.

This is a different kind of writing; parts of it sound a bit legalese, and the format is very specific. However, it exposes the students to a different audience and a different style of writing, and the research is opening them up to foreign countries they might never have read about

### Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

#### Religion:

In grade 6 religion, we are learning about the prophets and will soon begin looking at our Family Life program.

In grade 8, we have begun looking at the early Church in North America. We will also begin the Family Life program soon.

#### Social Studies:

In grade 5, we are completing the study about the Civil War.

Grade 6 students have begun looking at the continent of Australia and the region of Oceania.

In grade 7, we are about to begin learning the cause and effects of the War of 1812.

Grade 8 students will be completing a unit about FDR's New Deal programs.

# Miss Ashley Schaaf Standard Math & Challenge Math (6-7-8) Pre Algebra, (7-8) Algebra (7-8)

In standard math we are exploring integers.

In challenge math we are exploring basic geometric figures.

In pre-algebra we are exploring the foundations of geometry.

In algebra we are working with radical expressions.

As the climate crisis advances we must actively discern our responsibility not only to this planet, but to the marginalized communities disproportionately affected by it.
