

Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

Lo, the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the proud and all evildoers will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire, leaving them neither root nor branch, says the LORD of hosts. But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.

Reading 2 2 Thes 3:7-12

Brothers and sisters: You know how one must imitate us. For we did not act in a disorderly way among you, nor did we eat food received free from anyone. On the contrary, in toil and drudgery, night and day we worked, so as not to burden any of you. Not that we do not have the right. Rather, we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us. In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others. Such people we instruct and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to work quietly and to eat their own food.

Gospel Lk 21:5-19

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here--the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky. Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Second Grade News: Miss Hayley Franks
Second Grade has had a busy fall! We completed several hands-on projects to strengthen our understanding of pretty difficult math concepts, Addition with Regrouping! In Social Studies we made our voices heard by voting as members of a Class Democracy! We took advantage of our last few nice days to observe the trees as they changed for Fall. Second grade has begun preparation for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation. Please keep us in your prayers as we take this big step in our faith journey!

Miss Gretchen Decker: Art

As 1st Quarter came to an end, more art was displayed in the hallways from Rainbow Fish Watercolor Paintings to Abstract Sculptures! Early Childhood learned more about art museums, how to use watercolor, and ended the month with fun pumpkin paintings that they showed to their friends in school. Upper Classes finished off their Still Life Project that wowed lots of students and staff, and then created an abstract sculpture in groups.

Mrs. Connie Holbrook: Religion (5), Math (4-6), Literature/Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: In Math, November will be focused on decimals, particularly the basics and adding and subtracting. This is a life skill in order to work with money; therefore we will work on money skills often.

Reading class will be spent reading stories in book A. There will be a unit test before we begin book B. Vocabulary tests have also started and will occur the week after the spelling tests. The Eucharist is what will discuss in Religion class in November.

Fourth Grade: During Math class, the big push will be multiplication, beginning with multiplication facts. I

am hoping to include some fun projects as well as teach some strategies for memorizing multiplication facts. During Literature class the students have been reading stories from book A about hopes, dreams, and wishes. They will have a unit test for book A this month before book B is started. Vocabulary tests have also started and will occur the week after the spelling tests.

Sixth Grade Standard Math: The students have done a great job working on decimals.

Mr. Leonard Kraudel: Science/STREAM (4-5-6-7-8) Fourth Grade Science is learning about Energy, the different kinds (electrical, light, sound, mechanical, chemical) and how they transfer from one type to another, also the difference between potential and kinetic energies.

Fifth Grade is learning about Chemical Formulas of Compounds.

Sixth-7th-8th Grades are learning about Acids, Bases and the pH Scale.
