Advent Healing Services

When we think of the need for healing, we could think that such a need is more appropriate in the Season of Lent. Lent is the time where we are invited to meditate on and receive the Lord's mercy in our lives. This mercy heals us of our sins and the hurts in our lives that cause us to sin or make it more likely that we will sin. So why spend this upcoming Advent asking for healing in our lives?

This gives us courage to continue to long for Jesus' return with the refrain *Maranatha-come Lord Jesus!* Between these two experiences of hope fulfilled and hope longed for, there is the reality that God has made us promises for abundant life on Earth in the here and now.

God fulfills these promises to us through the gift of His loving mercy. This mercy not only forgives our sins but also frees us to more fully be the sons and daughters He always intended us to be. He wants sons and daughters unburdened by wounds, having had those wounds transformed as His are in His resurrected body.

These Advent gatherings of healing, then, are an expression of our hope. God has made promises to us and longs to fulfill them. With strengthened hope, we look forward to receiving Him more eagerly at the end of time.

A Prayer Before Holy Mass


