

Reading I Dn 7:13-14

As the visions during the night continued, I saw one like a Son of man coming, on the clouds of heaven; when he reached the Ancient One and was presented before him, the one like a Son of man received dominion, glory, and kingship; all peoples, nations, and languages serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away, his kingship shall not be destroyed.

From St. Vincent de Paul Society



SCHOOL NEWS

From Mrs. Tate: Pre-K B

The Pre-K Bears have had a very productive and fun October! We have learned several more letters and are beginning to write numbers. We did a science experiment with skittles and water, making them turn into a rainbow. We had our first fire drill with the alarm. The class "did fantastic" following the rules about where to go. Every week the class is getting better and better sitting in church. I'm so proud of them!

From Miss Franks, 2nd Grade

Second grade has had a busy, busy month! We took our first ever IOWA tests and did very well! In Social Studies we enjoyed learning about the importance of American Symbols and our role as citizens. We spent the last of the season's warm days doing math and phonics lessons outside whenever possible! Please keep Second grade in your prayers as we prepare for our First Reconciliation.

From Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: During Religion class, the students have been focusing on the Sacraments of Initiation. We started with Baptism, learning about how we enter into God's family. Then, we discussed how we renew that faith in Confirmation through receiving the Holy Spirit. Finally, we talked about the first Eucharist and what happened during Passover and the Last Supper. Next, we will be learning about the parts of the Mass. In Math, the students work on how to write and solve expressions and equations. During Literature, the students read a few short stories and focus on setting, sequencing, and summarizing.

Fourth Grade: During Math, our main focus has been on multiplication. The students are working hard on memorizing their facts quickly. In Literature, the students have read a few short stories. With our short stories, the students have worked on sequencing, setting, mood, and main ideas.

From Mr. McDermott: Physical Education

This month we finished volleyball. We practiced bumps, sets, serves, and spikes. We also did full scrimmages with the upper grades. We are currently doing basketball. We will be working on dribbling, shooting, and other skills.

From Mrs. Sioux Roslawski: Literature & English (6-7-8) The middle school students celebrated Red Ribbon Week by writing essays (7th and 8th graders) and poems (6th graders). We also prepped for NaNoWriMo, a month-long writing project. The 8th graders will be writing a 7,000-word story, the 7th, a 6,000-word story, and the 6th, a 5,000-word story. They prepped by plotting out their stories, choosing the main characters, and deciding upon the setting for their pieces. It should be an exciting month!

From Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion: Students in 6th grade have learned about Jacob and Esau and are beginning to learn about Joseph, the favorite son of Israel. Eighth grade students are working on the Marks of the Catholic Church. They have just completed "One" and are beginning to learn about "Holy."

Social Studies: Students in grades 7 & 8 are continuing their study of American History. The 8th graders are beginning to look at the period of Reconstruction following the Civil War, and the 7th graders are learning about the start of the English colonies. The 6th grade students have completed a unit on Ancient Egypt and are starting one on Ancient India. Grade 5 students completed their unit on Roanoke and Jamestown and are beginning to learn about early colonial history.
