Reading I Jer 33:14-16

The days are coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and Judah. In those days, in that time, I will raise up for David a just shoot; he shall do what is right and just in the land. In those days Judah shall be safe and Jerusalem shall dwell secure; this is what they shall call her: "The LORD our justice."

And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand. "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap. For that day will assault everyone who lives on the face of the earth. Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

Guest Column: Stewardship and Catholic Social Teaching By: Deacon Brian Selsor

Have you ever wondered how the hundreds of Catholic churches, schools, hospitals, charitable agencies, and institutions in our community were financed? Throughout the Church in St. Louis, we are blessed with literally thousands of buildings representing millions of dollars. Where did they all come from?

Generosity, stewardship, born from the empathy and wisdom of ordinary people living out the image and model depicted in the story of the Good Samaritan. The Good Samaritan story was Jesus' response to a question a lawyer asked..."who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29-37)

In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.

But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on Him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

The next day He took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said, "and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have."

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him."

The story has much to consider. The victim has been robbed and beaten. The image brings to mind a physical beating but it could also be a psychological one. In this story the theft is of possessions, but people can also be robbed of their dignity. The traveler who has compassion is a stranger to the community, like many who paid for the buildings we use are strangers to

us. The Samaritan mends the victim's wounds and takes him to an inn, a building – all of this is made possible by the generosity and the compassion of the Samaritan.

There are many such buildings in our diocese, financed and built by unnamed people of the past who, like the Samaritan, saw the needs of people and listened to and acted on the inspiration of bishops, priests, religious brothers, and sisters. They acted out of empathy for their neighbors and in response to faith, attentive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

Stewardship is our opportunity to help the Church continue in these sacred traditions. Our parishes, our Catholic schools and hospitals, our refugee centers, and our homeless shelters grew from a collective, self-initiated charity. We support these institutions because they exist to make Christ known in a physical way in our world.

Our story, *The Good Samaritan*, is frequently upheld as the model for Catholic Social Teaching and today we must let the story guide us. Note that the Samaritan is not an institution nor a government. Rather, he is a person – a steward of time, talent, and treasure, using his own resources to help a victim. The story does not depict an institution as the steward of charity. Rather, a person sees a person in need and provides for him. Out of his own resources he cares for the poor robbery victim.

Pope Francis encourages us to do likewise by emphasizing the term "accompaniment." Stewardship and Catholic Social Teaching are different ways of living out our empathy and pity for our neighbors. Jesus ends his story with the words "Go and do likewise." And so we should.
