Entrance Antiphon Cf. Est 4: 17

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

Reading 1 Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4

How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, "Violence!" but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and clamorous discord. Then the LORD answered me and said: "Write down the vision clearly upon the tablets, so that one can read it readily. For the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God. Take as your norm the sound words that you heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard this rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us.

Gospel Lk 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. "Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'"

All Things New Listening Sessions

On October 25 and 27, from 6:00-8:00pm, our parish will host the listening sessions as part of All Things New. These listening sessions will involve only the future of the parish. There will be announcements in the coming weeks about the process regarding schools.

Here are some common concerns relating directly to the sessions.

If you have questions regarding registration or need to change the date for your registration, please e-mail onlinesupport@catholicleaders.org. The parish office is not hosting the signups, so we have no ability to change your registration nor to confirm that your registration went through.

If you want to come to a listening session, but do not have a computer or an e-mail address, please contact the parish office and we will sign you up with the parish e-mail account.

Per the Archdiocese, we are not allowed to record or to livestream the listening sessions. If you are unable to come to a session, please contact the parish office, and we will help you to make an appointment with me, Deacon Bob, or with a Key Parish Leader to discuss the models that were shared at the listening sessions.

Listening Session Preparation

Now that we are in October, how do we prepare for these listening sessions?

First, we need to be clear on what they are about. All Things New is NOT about the Archdiocese nor the parish needing more money. All Things New is NOT about the need to recruit more students into Catholic schools. All Things New IS about our primary mission as a parish locally and a church in the Archdiocese. Our primary mission is helping people to become saints. This means that they actively practice the faith privately, through Mass and other communal times of prayer, through service, and through being a witness of faith to family and friends. All Things New is to help the Archdiocese get singularly focused on this purpose, with the goal of reversing the downward trend in numbers of Catholics, Baptisms, and marriages in the Catholic Church.

Second, we need to be prepared to give con-

structive feedback. From my own experience and from speaking with many brother priests, no priest, when speaking about the area he is serving, flat out said no to all of the models. All were constructive in giving thoughtful opinions about why one model was better than another. We need to be ready to give such feedback that helps move the conversation forward.

Third, and I mean this sincerely, we need to pray. We need to pray that our hearts are open to what is being presented to us. It is easy to give in to pride, cynicism, and fear. Several times since I have heard about this process, I have had moments where these words described my heart. But each time, the Lord moved in my life to continue to advance me forward on this process. If we are praying for God to be Lord of this process and Lord of our hearts, we will be able to overcome these default positions and move to dispositions of heart that the Lord can more easily use for His glory.

Convocation Week

Every four years, the Archbishop invites the priests of the Archdiocese to Tan-Tar-A for a week of meetings. This week is that week. Due to this meeting, the Mass schedule will be changed.

We will have 7:00 and 8:00am Masses on Monday. On Tuesday-Wednesday, we will only have a 7:00am Communion Service led by Deacon Bob. On Thursday, we will have 7:00am Communion Service and an 8:00am Mass. The Mass schedule will return to normal on Friday, October 7.

Due to Convocation, we will also not have Eucharistic Adoration this week.

Msgr. Stehly and I will be celebrating at Convocation the Mass intentions scheduled for Tuesday, Wednesday, and the 7:00am Mass on Thursday. If you have a Mass intention on one of those days and would prefer to have the Mass offered here, please contact the parish office to have your Mass rescheduled.


