Reading I Gn 2:18-24

The LORD God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him." So the LORD God formed out of the ground various wild animals and various birds of the air, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each of them would be its name. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all wild animals; but none proved to be the suitable partner for the man.

So the LORD God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, he took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. The LORD God then built up into a woman the rib that he had taken from the man. When he brought her to the man, the man said: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman,' for out of 'her man' this one has been taken." That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh.

Reading II Heb 2:9-11

Brothers and sisters: He "for a little while" was made "lower than the angels," that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. For it was fitting that he, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the leader to their salvation perfect through suffering. He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin. Therefore, he is not ashamed to call them "brothers."

Gospel Mk 10:2-16 or 10:2-12

The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife"? They were testing him. He said to them in reply, "What did Moses command you?" They replied, "Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her." But Jesus told them, "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

Feast of Saint Raphael the Archangel

Last weekend, I preached on the spiritual warfare of the angels and demons and how we are engaged in spiritual warfare as well. I also spoke on how we as parishioners of St. Raphael are called to be part of the healing charism of St. Raphael by receiving healing for our spiritual wounds and by being instruments of healing, especially to those beyond the boundaries of our parish.

In his reflections that helped to spark my homily this weekend, the Archbishop had a particular paragraph that really struck me. It did not fit well into my homily, but I think it good to call attention to it here. Our Archbishop wrote:

One of the key spiritual battles these days concerns a growing and pervasive sense of anxiety and fear which leads to a desire for control. When we give in to that, no matter what we do, our actions help the spirit of anxiety and fear to gain a tighter grip on the world. We fight that by fostering a sense of trust which allows us to surrender situations to God. It's important for us to realize what's going on there — that we're faced with a spiritual battle. When we realize that, we're more likely to fight the battle well — to let the spirit of trust and surrender grow, rather than the spirit of anxiety and control.

I pass along these words as a good examination of life. Am I seeking more control in my life? If so, is it coming from a place of anxiety and fear? How can I choose to surrender to and trust God instead of giving into the fear and anxiety?

Why Talk About Stewardship?

> First and foremost, because we are disciples of Jesus, we were made in His image and likeness. As Catholics we are called to imitate His life. We are to be His eyes, ears, and voice to build His kingdom on earth. As disciples, we are responsible not only for our own lives, but for the lives of others as well. We are called to be generous with the "first fruits" of all of our gifts. To give our first and best of everything, not simply what we have "leftover." Second, because we are all stewards of our gifts! Stewardship isn't an exclusive club for a few members. We all have gifts to share. All are invited and all are needed. No gift is too small or insignificant. Stewardship is a lifestyle. It is about putting God first in everything we do. Stewardship is the common thread that links all of our parish ministries together for the good of all.

Third, because stewardship is what has built our Church. Gratitude and generosity are fundamental to our Catholic faith.

New Bible Study Begins October 28

Everyone is welcome to join us on Thursday evenings at 7:00pm beginning October 28, in the lower level of the parish office, as we make our way through the book of *Acts*.

This video series presented by Dr. Mary Healy, entitled "Lectio Evangelization, Unveiling Scripture & Tradition," combines insightful Biblical study with Church teaching and practical advice to show how modern Catholics can effectively impact their world for Jesus Christ. She explores topics such as the call of Jesus to evangelize, the power of the Sacraments, the role of charisms for building up the Body of Christ, techniques from St. Paul for reaching a secular culture, and more.

Dr. Healy is professor of Sacred Scripture at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit and an international speaker on topics related to Scripture, evangelization, healing, and the spiritual life.

Using the *Lectio Divina* approach of reading, reflecting, responding, and contemplating, the accompanying workbook presents classic artistry, penetrating questions, and personal reflection to take the teachings to a deeper level.
