Gospel Mt 18:21-35

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

Dear Friends.

Our mission at Welcome Neighbor STL is to partner with refugee and immigrant families by connecting them with the people and opportunities that will empower them to begin their lives in St. Louis, Since November of 2021, Welcome Neighbor STL has matched almost 200 volunteers with over 300 refunees.

We have 12 refugee families waiting for volunteers with more families scheduled to arrive this year. We are reaching out to ask if your church would consider taking a more active role in welcoming refugees to St. Louis. We need your help!

Our Family Partnering program is looking for teams of 4-10 volunteers who will receive training, resources, and the opportunity to make a significant impact in helping newly-arrived refugee families acclimate to St. Louis. Individual volunteers can also be paired with a Family Partnering team.

There is no financial commitment, rather a time commitment. Teams can expect to spend 20 hours a month supporting a family. Though Family Partners commit to a year partnership – friendships evolve, and relationships often last a lifetime.

Some of the activities Family Partners assist our new refugees with include:

- · Welcoming them refugee families come alone and often feel alone, stating they really need and want a friend(s)
- Learning about local resources, i.e. food banks locations, how to access them and how they operate; places and
  resources that provide free clothing and furniture; and resources to assist with heating and lighting bills, if needed.
- Traversing the process to obtain medical and dental care. All informational resources are provided to volunteers.
   Orienting them to the city and transportation resources, often assisting with arranging/providing transportation.
- Orienting them to the city and transportation resources, often assisting with arranging/providing transportation.
   Assisting with financial practices, courtesy/cultural norms, and local customs, i.e. community festivals.
- Experiencing St. Louis favorites i.e. Botanical Gardens, the Zoo, St. Louis Cardinals, ice cream. pizza, etc.

We would love to connect and and discuss how you can partner with Welcome Neighbor as a refugee Family Partner. We're excited to explore opportunities together!

"We've been gifted a partnership with a family that exudes generosity and love. Love for each other, love for their community, and for us, too. And while it would be easy to give ourselves kudos for all that we've done, those of us who have worked closely with the Safis, find ourselves to be so blessed. 'It's more blessed to give than receive'...truer words were never spoken."
