Fr. Molini's Notes

Labor Day, September 4

Monday is the celebration of Labor Day.

Mass will be celebrated at St. Raphael at 8:00am on Labor Day.

Mass will be celebrated at St. Gabriel at 9:00am on Labor Day.

I hope you will start your day giving thanks to God for the gift of labor. It is the way we participate in the creative work of God, using our gifts and talents for the good of our families and others. God's work of creation is reflected in our work, our efforts to share His goodness. Let us all consider our participation in the work of God, whether we are young or old. All can contribute to the good of others through our efforts.

Wakes and Funerals

The growing practice of having a "wake" at church before the funeral was a response to families expecting a small number of people due to the advanced age of the deceased family member. It was never intended to be for a large group, necessitating the use of the main body of the church. Too often it became a misuse of the holy space set apart for God, and for prayer for the soul of the deceased. What resulted were loud conversations, unattended children running about, and the "house of prayer" becoming simply a gathering space.

In the future, "wakes" will still be permitted for an hour before funerals, but conversation will be limited to the vestibule of church. The deceased may be "in state" in the church to allow for prayers. We will continue to work with families to provide a space for small visitations, but our churches were not intended to be funeral parlors and cannot serve that purpose for larger gatherings. I apologize if this change in practice is off-putting, but frankly I've heard much more concern voiced over not maintaining reverence and interfering with a place for prayer and closeness to God.

On a separate note, I encourage families to discuss funeral plans earlier rather than later. More than once in the past, I've brought the Sacraments to a parishioner who spoke of devotion to and love for Christ and the Church, indicating a desire for a funeral Mass, only to have a non-practicing family member fail to arrange for a Mass. The faithful Catholic was denied a funeral because no clear plan had been prepared. Please, speak to your family about your desires. We are happy to help pre-plan funerals and assist with liturgy preparations well in advance of the need.

8:45 am Mass at St. Gabriel

Before I was on site, we had to formulate the Mass schedule and, given the fluidity of the situation, we came up with the current times for Mass. Now that I am here and living with the schedule, I've had several requests to return the St. Gabriel Mass to 8:00 am, primarily to accommodate greater parent participation at school Masses. I'm happy to entertain the conversation. If you feel strongly in either direction, please speak to me after Sunday Mass. I'd rather not have my email flooded with comments; just a simple yea or nay after Sunday Mass would be helpful. If the sentiment is strong to change back, I don't see a reason to hold off until January, although the daily school schedule may be affected.

Mass Intentions 2023-2024






